Things just improved for you! Expanded Admission Eligibility Guidelines

Not only have things changed at The Masonic Home during the pandemic in regard to visitors, outings, vaccines, isolation, etc. but we are thrilled to let you know that the eligibility guidelines for those wanting to apply for admission have been expanded.

The years of membership for Nebraska Masons and their eligible female relatives has been lowered to two years of continuous membership and good standing for pay basis or fraternal way application for admission. For Masons and their eligible female relatives with membership outside the Grand Lodge of Nebraska jurisdiction, continuous membership and good standing is now five years for pay basis application only.

Admission for female relatives of Masons has also been expanded to include the great granddaughter and mother-in-law of an eligible Mason.





Eastern Star ladies will be glad to know that if they don't qualify for admission as an eligible female relative of an eligible Mason, they may qualify on their own Eastern Star membership if they are also the step daughter, step sister, step mother, niece, aunt, sister-in-law, sister, half sister, mother-in-law, grand niece, adopted daughter, or daughter-in-law of an eligible Mason.

Meet Robert "Hoagy" Hoagland from Kearney, NE . . .

Hoagy was born in Hastings, Nebraska, and lived there until his family moved to Kearney when he was 8 and his older sister was 14. You could say Hoagy was just a little passionate about music as he dreamed of becoming a music teacher. He belonged to the vocal group "Magicals" in high school and during his adult years he was a member of a local band as well as several country western bands that traveled throughout the Midwest.

The musical plan for his life was put on hold when he joined the Navy. Hoagy became a jet mechanic and was a good one at that. He wanted to just work on the planes, but the Navy recruited him to teach others instead. He went on to be a Master of Arms Ships Police.

Hoagy returned to Kearney after the Navy and brought his new bride, Pat, and her two daughters, Laura and Jill, with him. He says they never had much in common; they just weren't interested in the same things. Friends gave the relationship a year. This couple fooled them all; they found common ground and were married 50 years. In January of 2019 when Pat needed the kind of care that she had given to so many others in her lifetime as a nurse, Hoagy knew The Masonic Home was the best place for Pat to receive the care she so deserved.

Hoagy believes in being educated formally and informally, being passionate about what he enjoys, and working hard. These attributes led Hoagy to radio/TV repair, auto mechanics, and locksmith work. Unfortunately, hearing loss from the military squashed Hoagy's dream of teaching music. Not being a man to stand still for long, Hoagy has climbed TV towers in all kinds of weather, repaired Fords, Chryslers, Chevrolets, Volkswagons and BMWs, enjoyed being in the pit crew for a local Kearney drag racer, and repaired locks of all kinds.

Another passion for this kind, caring, and devoted man is the Masonic fraternity and its appendant bodies. His Masonic affiliations include Rob Morris Lodge No. 46, Jachin Lodge No. 116, Tehama Shrine, Hastings York Rite, Hastings Scottish Rite, and Tuscan Chapter No. 35 O.E.S. He is a Past Master of both lodges, been Certified Proficient for 17 years, is a Past Patron in O.E.S. three times, and served as Senior Deacon for five years. (According to Hoagy, this is the best seat in the lodge room.) Hoagy also has a dream of going to outdoor degree work on horseback in Casper, Wyoming.

In August 2020 Hoagy ran into some serious health issues and was life flighted from Kearney to Omaha. When he was able to leave the hospital and rehab, he knew then that The Masonic Home was the only place to go for further recuperation. He recuperated so well that he is pleased to call The Masonic Home his home and is very happy living independently in an apartment.
