Anton's family came to the U.S. when Anton was 12 years old and they settled on a farm in Stanton, Nebraska. Molly was born and raised in Weston, Nebraska. The two met at a picnic and later married and moved to Prague. Maxine's dad was the town veterinarian and Molly was a homemaker.

The veterinary clinic was based out of their home, so Maxine grew up with all kinds of animals around her. In order to spend special time with her dad Maxine went along with her dad on many of his veterinarian calls. She said as she got older that he would let her drive and those words were spoken and shared with a twinkle in her eye! The two of them referred to the area of Prague as the Bohemian Alps! She would drive them to the top of the hill, put the car into neutral, and coast all the way back down. Boy what a ride!

Maxine remembers that her dad had the opportunity of a life time in 1927. The American Legion had their National Convention in New York City and offered people like Anton a discounted ticket to go back and see their home country. It was a wonderful experience for which he was very appreciative.

Maxine's family spoke only Czech in their home so when she got to kindergarten, she had to learn English. She attended Prague from elementary through high school.

Maxine was involved in many activities. While growing up in Prague she joined the Prague Drum & Bugle Corps as a drummer. They performed for local and state fairs and many other events. For Maxine it was a great way to get out of town and see other places, meet new people, and have different experiences.

Maxine belonged to the American Home Economics Association, the American Dietician Association and was President of the Nebraska Dietician Association. She was also eligible to be a member of the Legion Auxiliary because of her father's service in World War I.

Maxine's father was a member of North Bend Lodge No. 219 which made her eligible to apply for admission to The Nebraska Masonic Home. So in January of 2019 after 95 years of being a strong independent woman with a successful career and wanderlust in retirement, Maxine decided to make The Nebraska Masonic Home her home. She is so glad that she did . . . she was able to make the move with the help of two very good friends who encouraged her the whole way. Maxine is glad to be rid of the myriad of chores and maintenance that weighs a homeowner down. Now she looks out the window during each of the four seasons and enjoys the beauty of the landscape rather than dreading the chores that come with home ownership.
