Meet Our Resident Larry McGlade

Larry's senior year at Thomas Jefferson High School, he had his sights set for the future. He whistled at the beautiful blonde girl at the water fountain, knowing she was the one he wanted to spend the rest of his life with. And, that pretty blonde liked his car! From there, they dated and fell in love. Larry and Elizabeth (Holmberg) were united in marriage on November 19, 1960 in Rock Port, MO. They enjoyed being with each other and taking time to enjoy Larry's fine cars, time with friends and planning their future. Larry worked at Tip Top Products Company and attended Iowa Western Community College with a concentration in law enforcement. Then he attended UNO and earned a Criminal Justice Degree.

After he graduated from Iowa Western Community College, life really began! Their first child was born and Larry joined the Council Bluffs police department in 1965. He had many different jobs within the police department which included street patrol, motorcycle patrol, detective, sergeant, lieutenant, and retired as Captain McGlade, with 33 years of service. He was offered the Chief of Police position and turned it down. The job was a valuable life-long learning experience, and he was able to show his children and grandchildren the value of being good citizens and helping others in need. During his career as a police officer, he took on side jobs as a security guard and worked extra shifts at the police department with the STOP and ASAP programs. Larry was also in charge of the SWAT Team and was a Firearms instructor for the Council Bluffs Police Department.

While employed at the Council Bluffs Police Department, Larry saw a need for a funeral home escort service. He bought two brand new cars and started a funeral escort service for Council Bluffs and funeral homes in the surrounding area. Larry was quite the entreprenur; he also started a sewer and water business. He could fix anything from broken water lines to septic tanks. Due to the extremely long work days, he decided it was time to slow down and sold these businesses. After a short hiatus, he began his next adventure with his wife Elizabeth. Together, they opened a stained glass studio called "The Real Thing" where they taught classes and created custom windows and stained glass features. One of the popular attractions they created is the American Eagle that is still on display at the Fraternal Order of Eagles Club #104 in Council Bluffs.



The McGlades raised two girls; Julianne and Shellie and two boys; Randall and Zane. During the time he was working as a security guard at the Christian Home, Larry met a sibling set of three. Larry and Elizabeth decided together that they would help raise these three children, and they had them for three years. Larry says, "Our home was always full of love, shenanigans, business and fun! We had a good balance and a good foundation, we worked together."

Larry loved spending every moment he could with his wife and children . . . fishing with the boys, family vacations with the camper and tent camping and Larry's shooting competitions. The double feature at the drive-in was a favorite complete with a packed cooler and plenty of popcorn. The family was eager to try new adventures and added goats, geese, ducks, dogs, cats, reptiles, birds and more to their list. A huge family garden kept them busy during the summer, and Larry joined the children in Judo classes.

With all these responsibilities and adventures Larry still found time to devote to civic endeavors. In 1972 he joined Excelsior Lodge No. 377 of Council Bluffs, Iowa and served on the Salvation Army Board of Directors for 15 years.

In September 2022, Larry came to live at The Nebraska Masonic Home where he enjoys working out on the excercise bike, Wii bowling, and attending happy hour and holiday events. We are pleased that Larry decided to join our family at The Nebraska Masonic Home.
