What a glorious time of year. Winter is over, the trees are budding, and the grass is beginning to turn green. Spring is in the air.

Thank you for your outstanding support of our Big Chill project. Let me update you - we have raised approximately \$230,000 and have a new lower bid for **\$800,000**. Honestly, we still have a long way to go. We can pay for the entire project if every Mason and Eastern Star member in Nebraska donates \$80. This amount does not sound like much when you break it down like that. The reality is that **we need your support** for this project today.

Your support of The Nebraska Masonic Home is genuinely appreciated. You are an amazing group of people.

Our new goal is to raise \$570,000 to finish the purchase of this project. I know this is huge, but it is attainable with an \$80 donation from each of you.

For those of you who do not know about **The Big Chill** let me give you a little bit of information. We have an industrial chiller that must be replaced. This piece of equipment cools 80% of our building. Without this industrial chiller we cannot maintain the temperature required to keep our residents safe from the heat of the Nebraska summer. And as we have seen this year already, the feverish temperatures do not always wait until summer.

We need your help!!!! In the next 3 months, I would like to see every Mason and Eastern Star member in the state of Nebraska contribute \$80 to this project. Please, help us meet this goal so we aren't forced to draw down The Foundation's endowment account.

Meet our Resident June Nielsen . . .



June Nielsen was born in Windsor, Colorado, to Glenn and Esther Smith. They were a farm family with three girls and a boy. June attended school in a one-room country school through sixth grade. It was then on to a bigger school in Windsor, Colorado, where she graduated in 1956. Education was important to June, so she attended Colorado State University and graduated in 1960 with a major in Business Administration. Her first job was teaching high school business classes in Fort Lipton, Colorado, from 1960 to 1965.

June's friends decided it was time for her to do some dating, so they set her up on a blind date with Jens Nielsen. This tall handsome man was a first generation American, his family immigrated to the U.S. from Denmark and had settled in Oberlin, Kansas. The blind date went well . . . June and Jens were married in 1965 and started their new life together in Englewood, Colorado, where June was the school librarian at North Glenn High School for two years. Jens had a job at the Englewood Co-op until 1967 when they moved to Sidney, Nebraska, where he worked for another Co-op.

In her youth, June belonged to the International Order of the Rainbow for Girls, an organization of which she is very passionate. She even went as far as to tell Jens that he had to become a Mason when they had a girl. June is a Past Worthy Advisor and was given the Grand Cross of Color for outstanding service.

June and Jens had a wonderful relationship. They were always kind to and supportive of each other. Together they raised three children -- Erik, Sharon and Kurt. When Sharon came along, Jens joined James L. Eatmon Lodge in Kimball. June was not kidding! He was truly committed to Masonry and presided at all of the funeral services; June served as secretary of Truth Chapter O.E.S. in Kimball for 39 years. The two of them loved the people and camaraderie in their Masonic organizations and their church and were very active in both. They were a busy family!

Together they made one final move to Kimball, Nebraska, where they raised their children. June was a substitute teacher for 39 years at the high school in Kimball. Since there wasn't a



Rainbow Assembly in Kimball, she became involved with Job's Daughters International and served as Bethel Guardian and Grand Guardian of Nebraska. Her role as Bethel Guardian involved some traveling; she went as far as Vancouver, British Columbia, in Canada. June really loved working with the girls . . . she encouraged leadership development, strong speaking skills, and guided them to plan and execute effective and interesting activities. She remembers fondly how amazing it was to watch the girls mature into strong, independent women.

June's life changed in 2001 when Jens passed from cancer. The upkeep of a seven-bedroom home was too much when coupled with some health issues, so June sold the house and moved to Ogallala to be closer to her daughter. Then she moved to Hastings to an assisted living facility where she fell and broke her ankle and ended up in Harvard at a rehab facility. It took June a bit, but June finally came to The Nebraska Masonic Home where she belongs and where she is blessed to once again be surrounded by her Masonic family.
